# A Quarter of a Century Documenting Maroota and Environs



A fter 25 years, the Eastbend Rural Communications Inc is moving from the Resource Centre in Maroota School.

Eastbend produces the Living Heritage magazine, which for the last two and a half decades has recorded district information past and present. As a result, much valuable material has collected in the Resource Centre over the years. This collection must now find a new home and is being moved into temporary storage.

A huge thank you to Eastbend members, Steve Cain, and the Wiseman's Ferry Men's Shed for helping with what turned out to be a very large move. (Pictured below)

Eastbend, taking its name from the dramatic bend to the east of the Hawkesbury River at Wiseman's Ferry, was and is inspired by the amazing nature of the Maroota Plateau. This area is rich in thousands of years of aboriginal history, unique geology, rare and diverse plants and animals and a European settlement history going back to convict times.

Amongst the photographs here, which are part of the Eastbend collection, is Uncle Colin Gale describing artefacts in an overhang beside the MacDonald River, another of a trio of Walter Schwebel, Albert Schwebel and Lance Allsop from around 1907 with their motorbikes. In future editions, the Living Heritage Magazine plans to showcase some examples from the Eastbend collection every month.

Hawkesbury Mayor Sarah McMahon opened the exhibition for us and we welcomed many sales. # ECO-NEWS

That a commotion to be woken by this morning- an incessant cry from one of the Wood Ducks. Deciding I'd better investigate, I went outside to find only one of the pair walking around and around and giving a loud mournful call. I went to feed her but she walked off up the hill, then her mate flew in. Something must have frightened them as they were skittish all day.

I heard another commotion a few days later and watched as a few birds flew across the yard and into a tall gum tree, making a sound that I did not recognize. Later they were closer in a very dense leafed tree so I was able to get a closer look - a pair of just out of the nest Crimson Rosellas.

Pamela has had a few visitors to her place lately. A very cheeky Lace Monitor went for a wander on her veranda, and a Green Tree Snake was enjoying the sun, also on the veranda. Outside she saw a large Goanna at the base of a tree. Must be reptile

I've heard the Spotted Drongo lately calling for his mate.

On Christmas evening a friend of mine was outside in the cool when a cicada landed on her arm. What an unusual creature it turned out to be. It didn't fly away as its wings were just drying and it crawled on her son's arm too. It was a white cicada with blue wings that darkened as they dried. They are very rare and stay in the ground for 18 years instead of the usual 7.

Whilst gardening I found the wings and part of the carcase of a cicada that had been feasted on by a bird-it had the biggest wings of any cicada that I have ever seen.

I usually only have one pair of Wood Ducks who come for a snack. The other day I walked out to feed them and there they were 9 ducks in total - a family with 4 teenagers and 3 more adults.

Last night (Feb 4th) we saw what we thought was a huge moth flying around in our house. When it settled on a wall I saw that it was an Insectivorous Bat - I have not seen one around here since the development next door was commenced and the

developers emptied the huge dam that was there. The bats love to swoop over the dams collecting insects. Amazingly they consume at least half their body weight in insects per night, mainly moths and can eat 3000 insects in a single night - including mosquitoes, so they are good pest exterminators. Insectivore bats are incredibly intelligent, comparable (or more) to dolphins and horses. They live 10 -20 or even 30 years. Maybe this one has come from the disturbed area in the new development on Sackville Ferry Road near the Rural Fire Brigade.

If a little bat comes into your home DO NOT TOUCH IT. Open the doors/windows so it can fly out and only use long leather gloves if you have to remove it. If it bites you or touches you seek medical advice.

Nevertheless they are very cute!

### New Boat Ramp For Wisemans

### New Wisemans Ferry boat ramp brings hope to flood affected community

Following the devastation of two major flood events in 2022, a new three-lane boat ramp at Wisemans Ferry has been launched, breathing new life into the recreational facilities of the picturesque Hawkesbury River community. Project-managed by Hornsby Shire Council and co-funded by The Hills Shire Council and the NSW Government, the new boat ramp is complemented by a new pontoon, a new car park with 163 bays for vehicles and boat trailers and 29 bays for single vehicles, and a new amenities block. It will greatly increase the ability of locals and visitors to enjoy the water.

The boat ramp and associated facilities are now ready for a wonderful year ahead. Hornsby Shire Council also secured funding from the NSW Government to construct a new playground, which is now open, as well as a walking trail and village green which will be built in 2023.

NSW Maritime Executive Director Mark Hutchings said it was great to see the project, which was part of the NSW Government's Boating Now program, come to fruition.

"The Boating Now program, now it its fourth round, has invested in about 330 projects since it began in 2014, providing funding to improve maritime infrastructure and facilities across NSW," he said.





# Beyond The Fence

### Is there a silver lining amongst the interest rate tsunami?

As we power on into the new year it appears there is no respite for households with a mortgage. February delivered another 0.25% rate rise with a warning from the Reserve Bank Governor Dr Philip Lowe that there is more pain to come as inflation remains at its highest level for decades. Dr Lowe has received significant criticism around his repeated stance that interest rates would not increase until 2024.

A recent article by John Hawkins published in "The Conversation" 17th February 2023 points to the return of the inflation stick as the RBA's weapon against chronic high inflation. Mr Hawkins comments, "It is about 30 years since the Reserve Bank "snapped the inflation stick" by adopting a policy intended to keep inflation, on average, within a 2-3% target range. Since then, inflation has indeed averaged 2.5%." But inflation is now 7.8%,

its highest level since 1990. Lowe said this was "way too high" and that the bank was determined to get the rate back below

In a statement released by the RBA Governor, he notes that inflation is expected to decline to around 4.75% this year and returning to a target range of 3% by mid-2025.

It does however appear that buyers may be factoring in rate rises and taking advantage of the correction in prices. Interestingly at the time of writing, Core Logic reports a remarkable Sydney clearance rate of 78% with the Hills/Hawkesbury specifically at 76.9%. There was also a 16% increase in the number of auctions from the previous week, yet numbers are down considerably year on year.

This positive sentiment is shared by real estate veteran and property commentator John McGrath. In a recent article in the Sydney Morning Herald, Mr McGrath said the housing market was showing signs -judged by weekend auctions that buyers believe interest rates are near their peak, and this has sent them back into buying properties. "Our view is the next stage of the market will be a consolidation, featuring a plateauing of prices, followed by further upward growth in property values in 2024."

In our local market, buyer enquiry has remained strong, particularly in the midtier, tree-change sector. Well presented, well priced homes continue to attract significant interest from buyers. Stock levels continue to remain low supporting underpinning a plateauing of prices.

# A Visit to Canberra and the National Museum By Liz Wilkinson

irstly a correction from last month's story - the old car was not the one used by Queen Elizabeth11 on her



first visit to Australia but a 1926 Crossley Landaulette that the late Queen Mother drove in, to the opening of Parliament in 1927 when she was the Duchess of York. This car was restored in the 70's.

The Queen's Daimler (DE36) is one of two intact survivors of six originally commissioned by the Australian Prime Minister Ben Chifley in preparation for the 1948 proposed royal tour by King George. When this was cancelled due to ill health, two cars were sold to the Maharaja. Being unable to sell the rest as they were too expensive, the remaining four Daimlers were shipped to Australia in 1949, and added to the pool that at times were used by the Governor General - Sir William McKell. The four cars were readied for duty when the young Queen came on tour in 1954. This tour was a massive undertaking so that as many people as possible could get to see the Queen.

After the tour the now six year old cars were replaced by newer Humber vehicles. The DE36 went to the Governor of S.A.- Sir Robert George and graced many vice regal occasions. By 1960 it was again a surplus car . It had several more SA owners , then went to a private museum.

After passing through many interesting

sections of the museum, we finally get to the section that is the reason for our visit. We are in a room full of plastic bubbles that house individual cars and other

treasures. The Queen's Daimler was out of its bubble awaiting our viewing. The seats had been removed and




were in a special bubble for treatment. as they had found moths that were beginning to hatch with the warmer weather. The cars are vacuumed and checked weekly to prevent dirt accumulation and pests appearing.

As well as the special Daimler we saw many more cars - all with a history such as the first Holden that was sold commercially,

a steam engine that laid out all the roads in Canberra and the Peace Bus that drove around during the two hundred years

commemorations. I was very taken with an old tractor that pulled a long trailer covered in gadgets this was taken all over the country to sharpen knives, saws, mowers and mend just about





anything.



125 g butter


1/2 cup brown sugar (I always use dark)



ell, here we are charging on into the new year.

Following advocacy by The Hills, Hawkesbury and Hornsby Councils, the NSW State Government has provided metropolitan councils with additional funding to assist in road repairs. The Hills has been successful in receiving just over \$11 million for pothole road repairs. This funding will greatly assist. I thank residents for the ongoing patience with the repairs as council work through this and for continuing to report issues to council. Works are now occurring on Sackville Ferry Rd to repair the surface near the Ferry and the Cliftonville Rd repairs are well underway. Flood repairs and recovery works are still ongoing. I have been working closely with residents to resolve some long-standing issues and I look forward to having some of these closed out soon.

Council has been successful in receiving an additional \$6.6 million in west invest funding for a number of projects. This is in addition to the \$15 million already received for the proposed indoor recreation centre at Horseworld and flood warning systems. The competitive round has also seen funding for a new autism specific school for The Hills District at Box Hill.

The consultation period is currently underway for the proposed Mason Rd Reserve at Box Hill. Please have your say. As always, Council continues to work hard to deliver parks in Box Hill as quickly as possible.

his month the team have attended a number of call outs with wires down in St Albans Road, a fire in River Road, the boat ramp opening, and two motor vehicle accidents one of which was in Gunderman, and the other in River Road, Leets Vale.

The new boat ramp opening in Wisemans Ferry on 4th February was a great success and was attended by a large number of local residents. A sausage sizzle was provided by the Wisemans Ferry RFS team and displays on the day included the fire boat displaying the fire hose – the spray looked amazing as it set a backdrop to the proceedings. The boat ramp was officially opened by Hornsby Mayor, Phillip Ruddock; Hills Mayor, Peter Gangemi; and Member for the Hawkesbury, Robyn Preston MP.

### **Current Fire Situation**

Canoelands:

Permits for pile burns are still required until 31<sup>st</sup> March which is the end of the fire season. There are RFS standards for pile burns that recommend the following:

Only dry or dead vegetation may be burnt (no household rubbish such as plastics, wooden pallets or cardboard boxes).

Build long and low piles no greater than 2m in length or width, and no higher than 1.5m. This will spread the heat. Piles that are too high produce more intense heat and retain the heat for longer.

Do not add logs greater than 150mm in diameter. Instead use large logs to provide habitat and prevent erosion on your property.

If possible, place the pile in an area where it will receive direct sunlight to dry out the pile before burning.


### MAROOTA SOUTH RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

e are now two months into 2023, and the weather has been very mixed, to say the least. In late January, the Maroota South area received between 60 to 105 mm in a very short time. This storm started numerous fires in the Maroota forest area, but the rain extinguished them.

Then, just a few days later, we received a further 60 mm, and this storm also had a lot of lightning and hit the phone system. While this all ended well this time, it might not have had we not received the rain. Incidentally, some of the Lower Portland area has received nearly none of the rain.

There is a new app that every community member should have and use. This app is now called Hazards Near Me, and is an upgrade of the Fires Near Me app, but importantly, it now has flood information all on the one app. If you had the old Fires Near Me, you should find it automatically when the app updates to the Hazard app. You can then put in your settings and your watch zones so you are alerted as to what is happening in that zone. When there is adverse weather, please leave your phone on and connected to a data source so you receive any notifications.




